Reports of Children

This February, everything was in good order, with nearly all the children in good health, but some of them suffered from viral fever. However, the children were taken to the clinic for medical treatment after proper medical care; they were found well. The home mother and kitchen mother worked together to ensure that the children received the necessary medication and support to help her recover.

In Khushi school, a project was assigned by the subject teacher to create a globe using cardboard, paper, and various colours to make it visually appealing. She successfully completed the project by utilizing the materials creatively and making the globe stand out.

During this month, the birthday of Dewika was celebrated at Duhabi Home. A cake was bought for her special day. It was a joyous occasion filled with laughter and celebration.

At the school of Shristy and Bijay, there was a cultural dress program where they both participated by wearing traditional dress from their respective cultures. New cultural dresses were bought for the event and they enthusiastically took part in the program.







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Children actively participated in the cleanliness and maintenance of a flower garden by being divided into different tasks. They were provided with flower pots to give water and protect the plants. This new creative idea not only involved children in gardening but also taught them the importance of protecting plants.





Education

The children were busy with their school and tutoring classes at home, preparing for their final exams next month. While most children are doing well in their studies, some are struggling, and extra care is being given to help them improve. The tutor has been instructed to provide additional support and time to the weak students during this crucial time.

Field Visit

During a field visit in February, the counsellor and OM visited Dharan, where we met with the mother of Karan and Karuna. She had remarried and working as a garbage collector. However, she was struggling with heavy drinking and did not have a stable home. She's unable to take care of her children, and she's blind in one eye. The family's situation was concerning and they needed support.



Medical issues

In February, many children experienced fever, cold, aches, and sneezing due to the changing weather as it marked the beginning of summer. Medical treatment was necessary for them, so they were taken to the clinic for check-ups and treatment.

Staff Members

The office manager, security guard, and home mother worked for 28 days without taking any leave. The kitchen mother took a 3-day leave while her mother was admitted to the hospital. the Home Mother managed her tasks with help from the guard. She cared for the children, the Kitchen Mother prepared food and cleaned, while the security guard took the children to school and ensured their safety at home.

Repair and Maintenance

The basin taps, connection pipes, and water taps were replaced as well as the old fuses bulbs were replaced. The front door of the home was also painted to refresh its appearance further the old and damaged switchboards need to be replaced due to the risk of electric shock.





New project

The activity of painting on stones, which was well-received by all the children. They actively participated and expressed great joy in creating their unique stone paintings. Overall, the meeting was successful in involving the children in a creative activity and addressing their individual needs through counselling.

Points of attention

The toilet safety tank at home was full and overflowing with water, creating a potential breeding ground for insects and possibly leading to infections for the children. It was cleaned urgently in the first week of February by a technician, resolving the issue and preventing further health risks.
