Children remained safe and healthy this August without any serious diseases, they were feuded with the nutrients diet and proper care were provided to them. No such calamities happened at home.

Small Children plays in such a way that mothers get afraid if they get hurt, most of the time care givers stays with them.

Anju's 11th class results are out, and she got fail in one subject. Now, there will be a re-examination after a month, and she is dedicating more attention to her studies than before.

Education

All most children's study is satisfactory. Some of them are weak in their studies. Ram, Laxman, Karan, Karuna, and Abhay are weak in their studies, although they are being motivated towards their study. All the children are regularly attended their tuition classes and school.

Medical issues

Children remained safe and healthy this month as they were provided with a nutritious diet according to the dietician's food program schedule. Additionally, regular health check-ups were conducted to promptly address any potential issues. Overall, the well-being of the children was a top priority, and great efforts were made to ensure that they remained safe and healthy throughout the month.

Repair and Maintenance

New tube lights were installed in the kitchen, and the old furnace stove was also repaired.

Hygiene

Staff members of DH are trying their best to maintain a safe, hygienic, and healthy environment for the children. Hygiene is essential for the overall well-being and development of children. The hygiene of toilets and bathrooms is kept as the first priority.

Home mothers typically follow a regular cleaning schedule, using disinfectant sprays to clean surfaces such as basins, toilets, and bathrooms. The bedsheets and pillow covers are changed regularly and washed twice a week.

In addition to regular cleaning, staff members of DH are teaching children about proper hygiene practices, such as washing their hands after using the toilet and before eating.

Safety Measures

During the summer season, children are more susceptible to skin





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diseases due to the hot and humid weather. Sharing personal items such as towels, clothing, and toys can lead to the spread of bacteria and viruses that cause skin infections. In order to prevent the spread of these diseases, children are instructed to use their own personal items and not share them with others. This practice helps reduce the risk of skin infections and keeps children healthy during the summer months.

Staff Members

Staff members overall worked for 31 days without being absent, OM was busy with the arranging documents of children according to the new law system.

New project

The municipality constructed a wall around the pond on the east side of the children's home, opened the fence, and then built the wall there. They agreed to build a fence across the opening in the boundary.

After the construction of pond side wall was completed, our exposed fence was re-surrounded with new fence, which is stronger than before and safe for children.



Feedback from the staff about the children and home -

All the children are taking regular bath at morning.

Small children sometimes fight with each other while brushing their teeth with each other's brush. To solve this, a new brush was bought for everyone and everyone's name was written on it.

The need of new water tank was seen as the consumption of water is high and its difficult for the children to take bath, wash their clothes and staff members too feel difficult to work in the kitchen, clean the toilet and bathroom with only water tank.



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Counsellor

Counsellor Raj Choudhary is giving counselling classes to children two days a week on Friday and Saturday, and the results of these classes are very good. There has been a change in the behaviour of all the children, and they are more motivated to study than before.



Improvements

After regular counselling sessions, children are now more disciplined than before.

Points of attention

Some repair work needs to be done in the bathroom, such as replacing the toilet seat, the toilet, and the bathroom door. They are completely damaged and should be replaced with a new aluminium one that does not deteriorate quickly due to water. Additionally, some faucets(taps) are damaged and need to be replaced.

New water tank is needed to be installed soon.
