The home mother and kitchen mother ensured she received the necessary medication and support for her recovery.

The children attended both school and tuition classes regularly with their hired tutor. The tutor was instructed to provide extra care to Shristi in her studies. The tuition time was extended from 1 hour to 1.5 hours per session, both in the morning and evening.

The children and staff members at home celebrated New Year by enjoying delicious food and exchanging greetings. The event was attended by all the children and staff members, and two board members were also invited on this occasion, making it a fun and festive gathering for everyone involved.

During this month, the birthday of Shristi was celebrated at Duhabi Home. A cake was bought for her special day, and the chairman and treasurer of Duhabi Home were invited on this occasion. It was a joyous occasion filled with laughter and celebration.

On 29th January, children, staff members, and board members of the Duhabi home went on a picnic at Panchayim Simsar. The President of SSCHD Netherlands also joined the picnic with the children. The children had a great time playing games and taking boat rides. Counsellor Mr. Raj Chaudhary organized additional activities for the children, and prizes were distributed by President Mr. Henk Hooghuis.
