#### **Reports of Children**

Everything was in good order, with nearly all the children in good health. The staff was also doing well. The children engaged in their daily routines, which included completing homework, studying, bathing, brushing their teeth, and practicing personal hygiene. They were also collaborating effectively with the home mother and kitchen mother in their tasks. Children are attending school consistently and engaging in their studies.



The majority of children's behaviour was typical. Occasionally, they would argue over trivial issues. The staff at the home consistently works to enhance their conduct. To facilitate this improvement, the children participate in counselling sessions twice a week, and we also provide guidance by sharing examples of notable individuals. Additionally, we narrate moral stories to further promote positive behaviour.

No such calamities happened at home.



The project to take citizenship of Anoj has finally been completed after considerable effort, and it has been obtained from the district administration office. Now, the only task remaining is to process Anju's citizenship card.

National Children's Rights Council (NCRC) Deputy Chairman and member visited DH, in the presence of DH members for discussions with OM and DH Chairman about organization. NCRC Deputy/Vice-Chairman reviewed all DH, children, and staff documents, suggesting updates for staff and children based on new NCRC criteria. They inspected rooms, kitchen, and beds, emphasizing the need to segregate girls and boys.



Discussions included DH challenges, issues with children's citizenship cards and birth certificates. NCRC pledged support for document updates, utilizing their representatives in every Municipality and Province.

#### Education

There have been no absences; everyone is performing well academically. The second terminal examination for this year is scheduled to take place starting in the second week of this month. The children were fully engaged in their examinations at school. Much of their time was dedicated to studying as they prepared for these important tests. A number of them also participated in additional coaching sessions with OM.

## **Beyond Education**

Bijay and Yubraj are passionate about drawing and arts, creating various artworks in their free time. Their creativity shines through different mediums like painting and sculpting. They use art to express themselves and continually improve their skills.

### Medical issues

Karan and Abhay suffered from skin infections, causing rashes. Their doctor prescribed medication to reduce itching and redness, leading to improvement. Following the doctor's instructions, they observed significant improvements in their skin. They continued using the medication until it completely healed, ensuring they consulted their doctor for any new symptoms.

### **Repair and Maintenance**

The name plates were created using bold letters to show the name of every room. They were firmly attached to the wall outside each room, making them easy to see and read. This setup would assist visitors in quickly finding and recognizing each space in the building.

The fence wall was painted and installed new water tank for house hold purpose of children.



#### **Contribution of Children**

On National Children's Day, there were several fun activities celebrated at home. Eight kids took part in a running game, while eight girls enjoyed a balloon bursting contest. Six boys raced to eat chocolate hidden in flour. Each game had its winners, and after that, there was a cultural program with dances, prizes, and cake cutting. The kids were really happy and full of joy.





## Hygiene

All the children help to maintain cleanliness at home but small children and girls play vital role to clean the surrounding, toilet and bathrooms. Regular cleanliness is practiced by home mother and kitchen mother.



In addition to regular cleaning, staff members of DH are teaching children about proper hygiene practices, such as washing their hands after using the toilet and before eating.

#### Safety Measures

Due to the rainy season, children at DH take precautions to protect themselves from diseases like dengue and skin infections. Personal items like clothing and hygiene products can help reduce skin diseases and prevent the spread of infections. Wearing full-body clothes can also protect against mosquito bites, which are common carriers of dengue fever. Children were instructed to use their personal things.

#### Staff Members

Described the Code and Conduct and Job description to the staff members and instructed the staff members to work accordingly to it. The Code of Conduct sets ethical standards for staff members, ensuring respect, confidentiality, honesty, transparency, and adherence to organization policies. It fosters a positive work environment. The job description outlines responsibilities, performance indicators, and reporting structures for each staff member. By adhering to these guidelines, staff
