



Report of Duhabi Children Home Sunsari / Nepal covering the month of June 2026



Reports of Children

During the month, school uniforms and shoes were purchased for the children who required them. All items were provided according to the specific uniform design and colour requirements of their respective schools, ensuring the children were well-prepared and appropriately dressed for school.

Birthday Celebration

The birthdays of children were celebrated regularly at the home, making each child feel valued and special. These celebrations created a joyful atmosphere and promoted a sense of belonging among the children.

An interaction program was organized involving the children, staff members, the Manager, and the Counsellor. Both the Manager and the Counsellor actively participated in the activities and competitions. At the beginning of the session, the Manager demonstrated how to communicate confidently and respectfully with others. After the demonstration, three rounds of interaction activities were conducted.

Initially, many of the children felt shy and hesitant to speak in front of others. However, as the activities progressed, they became more confident and actively participated in the discussions. By the end of the program, every child was able to express themselves freely without hesitation and felt comfortable communicating with both the staff and their fellow children. The program helped improve the children's confidence, communication skills, and social interaction.



Different activities were organized for the children at the home. Every Saturday, various games and recreational competitions were conducted to encourage participation and enjoyment. All younger children actively took part in activities such as sack races, pencil races, and book-on-head races. Dance competitions and other fun events were also organized. The children were enthusiastic and happy throughout the activities, and the events provided an enjoyable opportunity for learning, recreation, and social interaction.

Education

During this month, several meetings were held with the tutors to review the children progress. It was observed that Ram, Laxman, Karan, and Abhay require additional academic support, as they often do not follow the tuition teacher instructions and are unable to complete their homework on time. They need closer supervision and extra study sessions to improve their learning and classroom performance.

The tutors also recommended additional academic support for the older children, including Khushi, Urmila, and Dewika. As they are studying in higher grades, they require more advanced guidance and subject-specific instruction. To meet their educational needs, the home is considering either appointing an additional qualified tutor or enrolling them in a coaching institute for extra academic support.

Staff Members

During this month, all staff members were regularly present at their duties. One tutor took four days of leave due to a family function at her home. During her absence, the Manager conducted the children's study classes to ensure that their learning was not interrupted.

The other staff members attended their duties regularly. The Home Mother and Kitchen Mother were instructed to work closely with the children, providing proper care, guidance, and supervision to support their daily needs and well-being.

Hygiene and Cleanliness

During the month, a high standard of cleanliness and hygiene was maintained throughout the children's home. Regular cleaning schedules were followed to ensure that all living areas, toilets, bathrooms, kitchen, and surrounding premises remained clean, safe, and healthy for the children and staff.

Cleaning Activities

- Toilets and bathrooms were cleaned twice daily by the Home Mother to maintain proper sanitation.
- The kitchen was cleaned four times each day, particularly after breakfast and meal preparation, to ensure food hygiene and cleanliness.
- All rooms, common areas, and the surrounding premises were cleaned regularly according to the daily cleaning schedule.

Additional Maintenance

- Unused and worn-out clothes and shoes were sorted and disposed of appropriately during the month.
- The terrace was thoroughly cleaned as part of the monthly maintenance activities.

Participation and Support

- Older children actively participated in cleaning the home and surrounding areas under the guidance of the staff. Their involvement helped develop a sense of responsibility and teamwork while contributing to a clean and healthy environment.
- All staff members remained committed to maintaining proper hygiene and sanitation standards throughout the month.

Overall, the home remained clean, hygienic, and well-maintained, providing a safe and healthy living environment for all children.

Repair and maintenance

Due to strong winds, storms, and lightning, several electrical appliances at the home were damaged. The damaged items include the office printer, the washing machine, the office ceiling fan, and the kitchen fan.

Immediate repair and maintenance of these items are necessary. The damaged office fan has already been replaced, and the kitchen fan has been sent for repair. However, the office printer and washing machine still require maintenance. The scanner cable of the printer has been damaged, and the washing machine's kit has also been damaged, making it non-functional. These items need to be repaired as soon as possible to ensure the smooth operation of the home.
